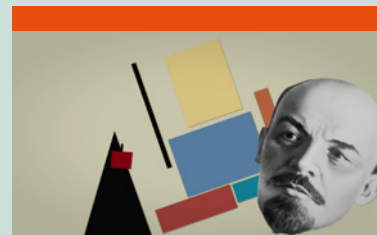

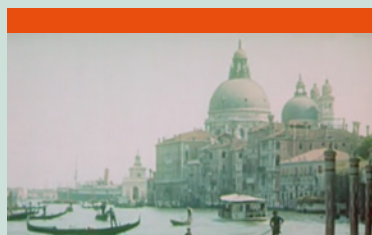

STUCKY, THE LAST MERCHANTS OF VENICE 52'

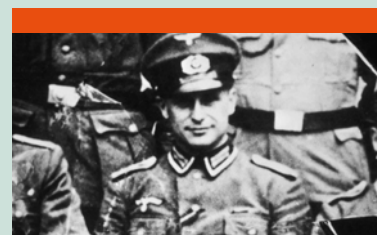
This is the fascinating story of a Venice from the late 19th century to the rise of Mussolini through the saga of one of its richest families: the Stucky family.

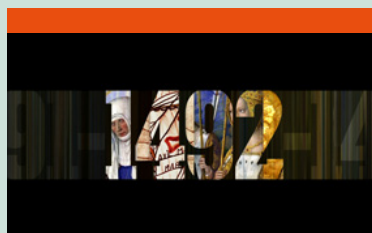

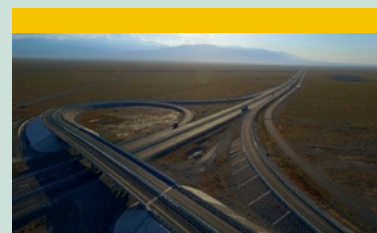

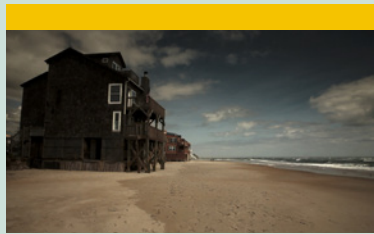


CHINA'S CONQUEST OF THE WEST 52'

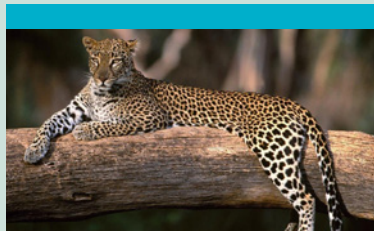

Embark on a world tour of ancestral medicinal practices with Bernard Fontanille - an emergency doctor used to operations in difficult conditions - through majestic landscapes.



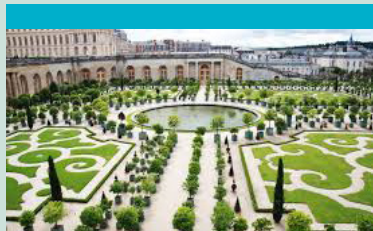
WIND QUEST 28x52'

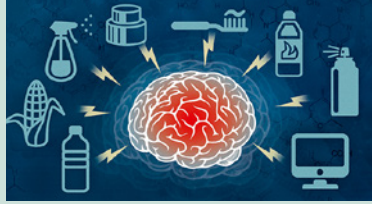

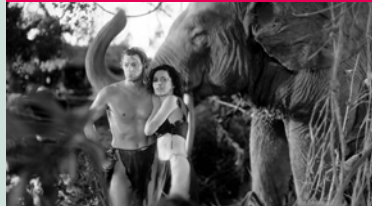

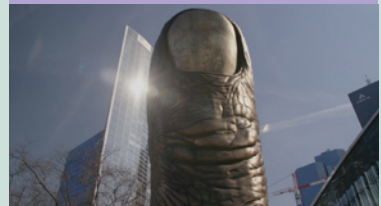

Between narrative compression and visual expansion, this one-hour film skillfully pieces together the career spanning five decades of an unclassifiable artist.



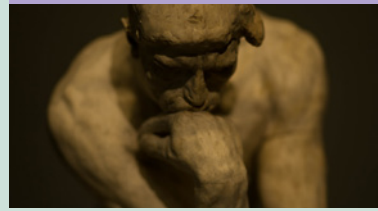
DAVID HOCKNEY, TIME RECLAIMED 52'

GAUGUIN, I'M A SAVAGE 52'

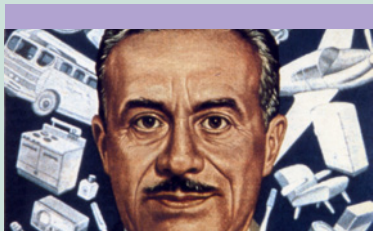
How the self-taught painter and sculptor left his wife, children and livelihood to devote his life to his art then lived in destitution before exiling himself in Tahiti.

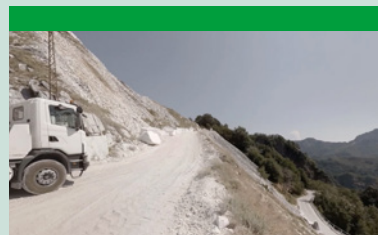

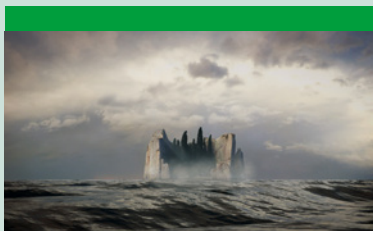

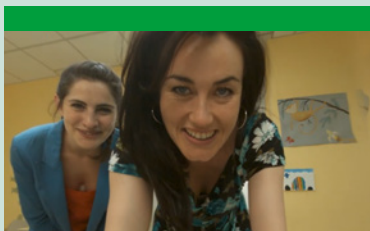

FARAH DIBA PAHLAVI, THE LAST EMPRESS 52'
The documentary tells the turbulent life story of Farah Diba Pahlavi who became the first and only empress in the history of Persia fifty years ago, in 1967.



IRAN, DREAMS OF EMPIRE 52'
Syria, Iraq, Lebanon, Saudi Arabia, Yemen ... Also Russia, United States, France ... This film aims to analyze in depth Iran's strategic objectives in the Middle East.



TUTANKHAMUN, A REDISCOVERED TREASURE 52'
What exactly happened to all the objects found by Howard Carter after he finished exploring Tutankhamun's tomb in 1930, after they have been lying there for the past 3200 years.



WARRING BORTHERS: FROM ATATURK TO ERDOGAN 52'
The idea behind this film is straightforward: explaining why no one understands what's going on in Turkey any more. And the point? Freeing our gaze from preconceived notions and from the illusion of perspective. Dig out, for the first time, a complete, unified vision of the Turks' path since the beginning of their existence as such. Meaning for the past 93 years, no more than the span of a person's lifetime.



THE PATRIARCHE AND THE TSAR 52'
This is the tale of a tango as old as the world itself: The alliance of the cross and the sword. Putin, the self-proclaimed Tsar of a nationalist Russia, and Kirill, the Patriarch of a Russian Orthodox church enjoying a boom, working hand-in-hand to boost their respective power.



ISLAM, THE HUMANITARIAN WAYS 52'
This film will shed light on the unknown reality of European Islamic humanitarianism, through its main organizations and the crossed destinies of some of their members in England, France and Germany. The film will try to answer a crucial question, in these times of incomprehension: is it beneficial for our societies or should we fear a sectarian drift?



RHINO DOLLARS 52'

Rhino Dollars is a documentary thriller about one of the world's most profitable illegal trades: Rhinoceros horn. At 50,000 euros a kilo, it sells on the black market for a higher price than gold or cocaine. Above all, it has become a symbol of wealth and social status in Asia, a gift for influential people, an instrument of corruption.



STARBUCK'S SECRET FORMULA 52' & 90'

The multinational coffee companies, with their identical convivial atmospheres and standardized products, have outlets in all the world's big cities. As advocates of responsible consumerism, the big chains have carved out a space for themselves based on a humanist rhetoric and high-end positioning. But what lies behind a cup of coffee that sells for five euros?



THE GREAT WALL OF JAPAN 52'

After the March 2011 disaster, Japanese authorities decided to build a gigantic 15 meter high and 500 kilometers wide anti-tsunami wall. Can there be another solution?



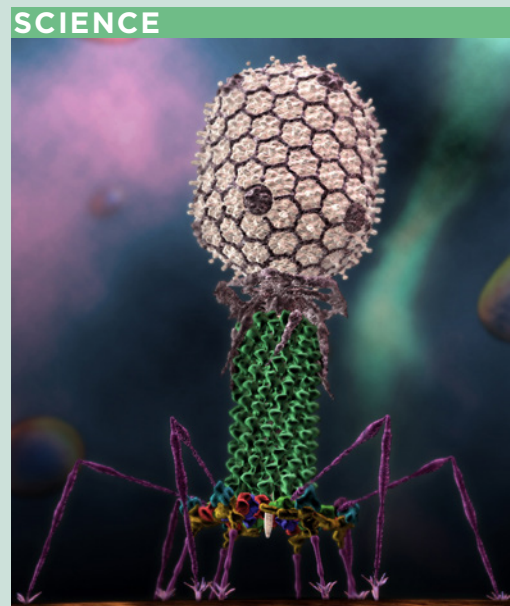
THE AGE OF BUILDERS: NOTRE-DAME 2x45' & 90'

In the Middle Ages, Paris gave birth to the world's most famous stone edifice: the Notre-Dame is a precious jewel of gothic architecture. Seven hundred years pass between the laying of the first stone during the 12th century and the restoration in the 18th. 3D animation and documentary will come together in a history film to give an accurate representation of this great historical fresco.



MY LIFE IN HITLER'S GERMANY 2x52'

In 1938 Harvard organizes a worldwide contest targeting exiled Germans who have fled the Nazi regime to the United States, France, Palestine, Australia, China, Switzerland, Japan, Italy... Almost 300 people answer and Harvard receives over 20.000 leaflets. Family and personal archive will illustrate these first person testimonies, as well as news archive from the time.



BACTERIA KILLERS 52'

How the amazing discovery by a young researcher, Félix d'Hérelle, at the start of the 20th century became one of the most extraordinary scientific adventures of all time. A discovery that enabled medicine to fight against bacterial epidemics before the advent of antibiotics, and which was then overshadowed by the latter.



SCHOOL OF TOMORROW 2x52'
 Modern day technology raises new problematics: in 20 years, two thirds of the students will hold jobs that have not been invented yet and 47% of current jobs are expected to be replaced by machines. Discover how scientists, teachers, and educators imagine the school of tomorrow.



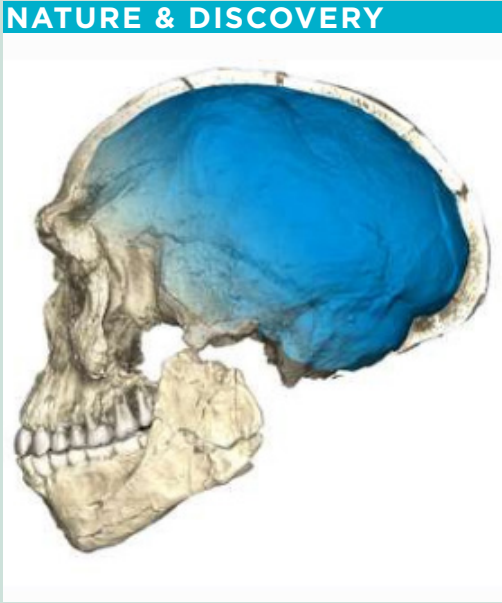
IN SEARCH OF LOST SLEEP 52'
 Our nights have become increasingly short – and our sleep has gradually become worse. Everywhere, researchers have joined forces to understand sleep and overcome its disorders. Beyond making us tired and irritable, sleeping badly also jeopardizes our health – it has been proven by now.



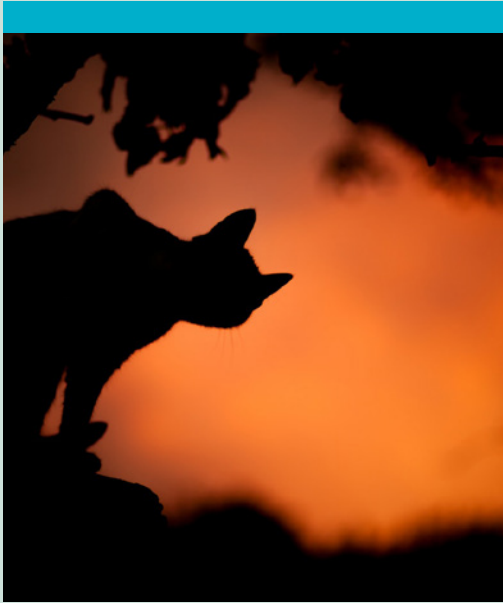
HOW VOLCANOES SHAPED THE WORLD 4x52' & 20x26'
 Volcanoes dominate human life in the most surprising ways. They are essential to our very existence. Astonishingly, we depend on volcanoes for the air we breathe, for the plant life that sustains us –and even for the origin of life itself. 40 volcanoes filmed across 6 continents to tell the amazing story of how volcanoes shaped almost every aspect of human existence.



PASTEUR VS KOCH: THE DUEL THAT CURED THE WORLD 52' & 90'
 At the end of the 19th century, epidemics of plague, cholera and tuberculosis were raging in Europe. Two visionaries – the Frenchman Louis Pasteur, a renowned chemist, and the German Robert Koch, a young country doctor – competed in the discovery of the microbe. Their outright battles revolutionized medicine and helped cure the world of these infectious diseases that were decimating humanity.



SAPIENS: THE NEW BEGINNING 52' & 90'
A discovery that revolutionizes all research on mankind's origins.
 In remote Morocco, in 1960, in the archeological site of Jebel Irhoud, a remarkable find was made: remains of Homo Sapiens. Today we can date them back to 300.000 years old. A discovery that rewrites the story of Mankind's origins, because up until now, the oldest remains found went back to 200.000 years ago! A revelation that not only stretches the timeline of Homo Sapiens' story, but also changes the geography of where we came from, the whole sub-Saharan region.



THE CAT, THE CUTEST KILLER 52'
 The movie takes you on an international trip to meet an invasive species: the cat. We will follow operations against the feline and full-scale actions on the ground to protect other species. This voyage will be an occasion to discover a variety of spaces and ecosystems, but also relatively unknown and surprising animals like Lyall's wren, the giant bat, the monk seal or the rat-kangaroo.
