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## SURINAM: THE ENGULFED TREASURE - 15-01-2011 **HD**

**When part of the Equatorial forest was drowned under litres of water to create an artificial lake in the 1960s, nobody could imagine that the submerged trees would later constitute a natural treasure.**

In 1964, the Republic of Surinam, the former Dutch Guyana, a country with high levels of bauxite in its soil, invested in the production of aluminium. The closure of the dyke on the Afobaka dam flooded part of the forest - over 1,500 square kilometres of land and nearly 50% of the Saramaca tribe's land. This constituted a trauma for the 6,000 inhabitants of the flooded zone, who were displaced then rehoused in make-shift shelters, about a hundred kilometres away in Brownsweg. But electricity is not the only resource produced by the artificial lake. The submerged tree trunks of the tropical forest constitute a veritable engulfed treasure - manna for the small republic.

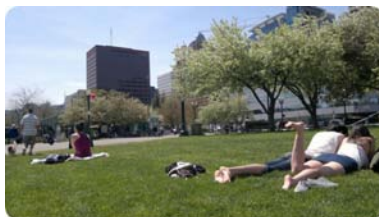

The changes in Russia over the last twenty years are reflected in developments in datchas. The individual refuge from a system that aimed to collectivise the lives of Russians has perhaps today become a place for Russians to escape the megapolis and its pollution. The datcha of the 21st century may also have become an ecological refuge.

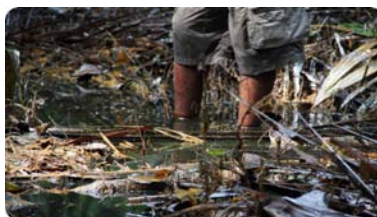

## RWANDA: HEALTH INSURANCE FOR ALL - 20-08-2011 **HD**

Rwanda, one of the poorest countries in the world, supplies a greater percentage of social welfare to its citizens than some of the world's richest countries. It has had a health insurance system in place for eleven years, and 92% of the population are covered. Annual contributions cost 2 dollars.

For this price, health cover provides the basic care to treat the main causes of fatal illness: diarrhea, pneumonia, malnutrition, and infected wounds. The health centres in general possess the basic drugs recommended by the World Health Organisation, and also have laboratories that can carry out the most common blood and urine tests, as well as tests for tuberculosis and malaria.

The town of Ozersk and its Mayak complex are a good example of this. The region of Mayak, which produced all the plutonium of the Cold War, is today a nuclear dustbin. It is protected by its ZATO status.

According to official statistics, which vary from one source to another, between 8,000 and 15,000 children, of which three quarters are male, disappear every year in China. They are victims of "human trafficking", which is half-heartedly fought by the authorities.

The kidnapers, who earn up to 8,000 euros per child, are rarely arrested and those who buy the children are rarely convicted. The victims are migrant workers, cut off from their families in remote towns. Poor and overloaded with work, they have maintained the tranquil customs of their home villages, leaving their children - always an only child - to play in the streets and the dormitory towns, where they cram in, in their thousands.

Following 3 days of clashes, which allegedly claimed between 26 and 33 lives, and left nearly 1,900 injured, the opposition between the army and demonstrators in Tahrir Square plunged Egypt into the worst crisis of the post-Mubarak era, which started on February 11.

To such an extent that it jeopardised the schedule of the various votes aimed at turning the page of the "transition" led by the Supreme Council of the Armed Forces, which promised to restore power into the hands of an elected president as soon as mid-June 2012. After the Fukushima shock wave and the decision to be nuclear-free by 2022, the energy sector is going through a difficult patch. But Germany has invested massively in cleaner and inexhaustible renewable energies.

After the Fukushima shock wave and the decision to be nuclear-free by 2022, the energy sector is going through a difficult patch. But Germany has invested massively in cleaner and inexhaustible renewable energies. The stated objective is to progress from a 17% renewable energy share in electricity production in 2010 to 35% by 2022, and to 80% by 2050. To achieve this objective, Germany is relying on state-of-the-art know-how and a vast energy-research programme. But in early April, the government decided to reduce solar energy subsidies, a decision that is forcing 3,000 workers in Bitterfeld's "Solar Valley" to fight for survival. The solar panel manufacturer "Q-Cells", the city's main employer and a victim of competition from China, has just announced it is filing for bankruptcy. Alongside the sudden drop in subsidies, solar power plant construction has also slowed down. Having banked on wind-driven energy for several years, Germany produces nearly 25% of world electricity production from wind. But the vagaries of the weather mean it needs the support of the large plants that stock the electricity. In this era of renewable energies, what future is there for the four major Germany suppliers of traditional energy: RWE, E.ON, EnBW and Vattenfall that are already in difficulty? To reach the 80% renewable energy objective by 2050, local initiatives are multiplying. But the German electricity giants do not intend to give up their slice of the cake. And what is more, despite the Fukushima catastrophe, many Germans still cannot imagine doing without the major energy groups.

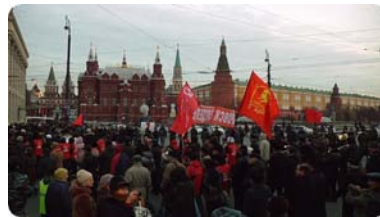

## RUSSIA: THE IMPOSSIBLE DEBATE - 03-12-2011 **HD**

The Russians are turning to sarcasm, especially since the results of the elections were announced three months ahead of time - the legislative elections on 4 December 2011, and the presidential elections on 4 March 2012. Vladimir Putin will return to the Kremlin for a third mandate, and Dmitri Medvedev will be his prime minister. Voters are feeling swindled.

This carefully orchestrated scenario has given a new lease of life to certain political movements. On the extreme right, nationalist and neo-nazi groups marched through Moscow with complete impunity, in early November, to a backdrop of racist slogans. On the left, the Communist Party took advantage of November 7, the anniversary of the 1917 Revolution, to remind people that it is the country's second political force. The votes they look likely to receive could stop "United Russia", the party in power, from totally controlling the Duma, or Parliament. On the threshold of these "locked" elections, the country's intelligentsia, has also decided to make its voice heard by reviving political satire. One "Citizen Poet" show is a sell out in Moscow and is getting a record number of hits on Internet. It contains caustic criticism of the authorities, and is aired every Monday on the "Echo of Moscow" radio station as well as on Youtube.

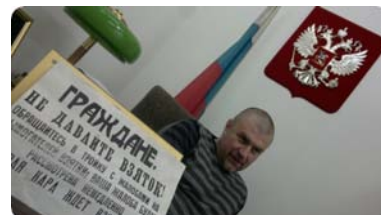

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Today, nearly 90% of illegal entries across the European Union's borders take place from Turkey to Greece. In 2011, over 50,000 clandestine immigrants, driven by poverty, crossed the Evros River to enter Europe.

The crossing is often dangerous: in 2011, 48 people drowned, and six others died on the riverbank from hypothermia. This phenomenon has been accentuated with the increase in patrols along the shores of Southern Italy and Spain, and with the reinforcement of monitoring in the Aegean Sea. The Greek police is overwhelmed by the extent of the influx of migrants: over the last three years, the number of migrants has tripled.

Going against mainstream media, she wants to portray the hope that MNLA Tuaregs are generating among the various populations in northern Mali, as well as their motivations, which are clearly different from the Islamist and Jihadist movements.
