Our two-wheeled wanderer discovers "bosseln", a local sport that is a combination of pétanque and curling, with intrepid players who don't mind disrupting road traffic. François accepts Tamme the "bone-breaker's" challenge, a two-metre giant who treats men and horses. He then travels back in time, on the wings of the wind, with Théo, a miller who is passionate about his profession.

He ends his journey in Flensburg, visiting a magnificent dockyard that houses wooden racing boats.

Here, in small cabins built from recycled materials handed down from generation to generation, local enthusiasts fight to keep them from demolition.

Attached to France for just three and a half centuries, following the 1659 Treaty, the department of the Eastern Pyrenees has preserved numerous links with Spanish Catalonia, of language, culture, and traditions.

After a visit to the Jochenstein hydroelectric power plant, our two-wheeled rover meets Jürgen. A forester and herbalist, Jürgen has lived in a caravan for the last seventeen years. He prepares a green soup, made from nine plants and invites François to go picking the ingredients with him. François then travels along the Danube in a canoe with Heidi Reichl, to the Donau-Auen National Park.

François ventures through the Bavarian forest, to the lake of Chiemsee. He starts his journey in a sublime national park spanning 24,250 hectares, where the commercial exploitation of wood has been stopped, in order to preserve nature.

In this region, the last glass blowers perpetuate the seven-century-old tradition. Among them is master glass blower Theodor Sellner, who lets François into the secrets of his craft. François also sets out in search of an animal that has been a subject of superstition since the Middle Ages: the lynx. He then boards one of the sternwheelers that has been linking the islands of Chiemsee to the mainland for a hundred and sixty years. It is also here that the king of Bavaria, impressed by the Chateau of Versailles, had the castle of Herrenchiemsee built in 1867. We meet the intendant of this dream venue.

Near to Bad Freienwalde, he puts his trusty Mobylette to one side and goes for a sleigh ride with Walter, the owner of a pack of dogs. A little further along on his travels, Tania takes him to her squirrel sanctuary. He ends his journey in a lake, on board a pocket submarine designed by a passionate inventor.







29 - THE MAGIC OF THE SPREEWALD

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On a small canal that snakes through the Spreewald - a part of Brandenburg made up of forests, marshes and canals - François listens to the legendary history of the place, told by Wolfgang the boatman.

Here, he discovers the Sorbs, a minority from Eastern Europe, who invite him to celebrate Saint John's Day according to their tradition: on horseback in a joyous cavalcade. Near Cottbus, Gehrart a farmer, shows him another local tradition, in the form of the gherkin, which is cultivated along the canals and exported all over Germany. In Straupitz, François visits Gerd's old mill. Gerd is Germany's last flax oil producers. His trip ends in a boat with Andrea, a postwoman, who carries out her very romantic round on water.

And in Potsdam, he discovers a hidden treasure at the Sanssouci Palace - a magnificent steam engine, built in 1840, to supply the castle's fountains.

In Cornouaille, the women, who use to be separated from their men at sea for long weeks at a time, would run life on land, in a quasimatriarchal society.

She is one of the only fisherwomen in Europe, and a real local star in the commune of Guilvinec. Along with Alexia, one of the last women to wear the Bigouden headdress, François is about to celebrate the 87th birthday of another Bigouden woman, Anna, who is a veritable living memory of the region.

He quickly finds the port of Le Conquet, from where he sets off for the islands of Molène and Ushant. In Molène, a small rock in the ocean, the mayor gives him exceptional authorisation to use his Mobylette on the roads of the commune.



Then, invited by the owner of the last Normandy "guingette", or open-air café, he grants himself the pleasure of a little dance, before heading off to visit the Amfreville dam, which was designed by Gustave Eiffel and which is the final lock before reaching the sea.
